Who we are

We are a multidisciplinary team with input from psychologists, a clinical nurse specialist, psychiatrists, and a social worker.

We provide an outpatient service in addition to working with inpatients on forensic and mental health wards.



Who is the service for

Men or women with a combination of mental health problems and a history of sexually inappropriate behaviour and/or sexual offending.

Partners of offenders*

Referrals are accepted from a range of sources including:

- Mental health teams
- Social services*
- Probation*
- ·Self-referrals (via GP)**

*Referrals of men or women without mental health problems and/or from outside the catchment area of the Trust are welcomed and subject to funding being agreed.

** If GP within Boroughs of Wandsworth, Merton, Sutton, Richmond.

Referral information should include GP details and relevant background material.

We do not usually accept referrals of anyone arrested or charged, but not yet convicted.

However, referrals are accepted in the absence of conviction, if there is substantive concern about sexual risk.



What we offer

Core functions of the service include risk assessment, clinical formulation, and opinion about likely response to treatment.

Following assessment, we give advice on risk management to the referrer. This may be accompanied by treatment or by consultation and liaison, including joint working and participating in the CPA process.

The team aims to tailor treatment to individual needs, and this may be delivered in groups, individually or a combination of both.

Our assessment and treatment approaches are evidence-based, and we aim to ensure that theoretical developments are integrated into our clinical practice.



What it's like

Treatment options include:

- The Partners and Relationships group: a 9-week group that is useful for men who would like to learn more about developing and keeping relationships, and for those who have ever had problems as a result of trying to meet a new partner or in their relationships in the past.
- Time-limited individual treatment, focusing on selfmanagement, for people whose likelihood of reoffending is relatively low
- Longer term individual psychological therapy.
- Psycho-educative work for partners of offenders about how to maximise protective capacity.
